COPYRIGHT and PHOTOCOPYING

- 1. The Music Publishers' Association Code of Practice on Photocopying Copyright Works makes the following concession for copying own choice pieces from volumes only for the use of the adjudicator at a festival, provided that the entrant or participant has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the Administrator of the festival immediately after the event.
- 2. Copyright for all Speech and Drama classes including duologues and group dramatic activity should be sought by performers at the time of entry to the competition. All dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.

DESCRIPTORS FOR GRADING PERFORMANCES

The festival uses the marks system:

90+ or OUTSTANDING	An exceptional performance, both technically and artistically
87-89 or DISTINCTION	An excellent performance technically and artistically
84-86 or COMMENDED	A convincing performance technically and artistically
81-83 or MERIT	A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or technical ability
78-80 or MODERATE	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication
75-77 or FAIR	A performance limited in its communication

TROPHY AND MEDAL POLICY

All certificates, medals, trophies and plaques are awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and the Festival Committee.

First, Second, and Third Prize certificates will be awarded in all Music and Speech and Drama classes where sufficient merit is shown.

In junior classes a keepsake Medal will be awarded to winners in the younger age groups, an enhanced First Prize Certificate will be awarded in the older age groups.

In Adult Classes an enhanced First Prize Certificate will be awarded to the winner of the class. A Trophy/Shield may be awarded to certain Adult Championship classes featuring Pianoforte, Vocal and Choral performances. Any such award will be for a period of up to a year and be returnable to the festival at the end of this period. The winner will bear the cost of any engraving.

WINNERS' CONCERT

A selection of winners will be invited to perform at the Festival's Winners' Concert; this will take place on **Saturday 11th March at 7pm in the Methodist Church**.

SPEECH & DRAMA ADJUDICATORS

Stephen Owen, BA(Hons) BA(Ed), MA, MA(Ed), PGDip(Ed), FLCM, LRAM, LGSM(Perf) LTCL(Perf)

Stephen trained as a teacher of drama, speech and movement at Trinity and All Saints' College, University of Leeds. After qualifying he studied with Eliner Rutherford. As well as being responsible for drama at the schools in which he worked, he also taught pupils of all ages and abilities privately, from complete beginners to Licentiate (RAM) and Fellowship (LCM) level. Since retiring from headship in July 2007, he has been appointed as examiner for the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA) and is an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals.

Maryrose Swarbrick

Maryrose is a UK-based actor and teacher. She has worked across radio, film and television, and has performed and directed everything from pantomime to Shakespeare in the theatre. She particularly enjoys working with new writers and in musical theatre. He voice was opera-trained by former Covent Garden soloist Brian Geldard. She founded Stage Door School of Performing Arts and Stage Door Theatre Company with her two daughters. For 16 years she held the position of Head of Drama at St Mary's Hall, Stonyhurst College. As Maryrose continues to work in the industry, she is well-placed to support and encourage the young (and not so young!) in all aspects of dance and drama, a mission enhanced in recent years by her role as adjudicator with The British and International Federation of Festivals. Her students have attended the most prestigious UK conservatoires including RADA, ARTs ED, LSMT and Mountview.

MUSIC ADJUDICATORS

Gaynor Keeble, BEd(Hons|), ARAM, ARCM, ALCM

Mezzo Soprano Gaynor worn scholarships to the University of Warwick and the Royal Academy of Music. She combines a busy performing career with teaching both privately and at the University of Warwick; recent operatic engagements has included Rome and the USA A member of Welsh National Opera for three years, she has worked for the Roya Opera, Opera North, D'Oyly Carte Mid-Wales and English Touring Opera. Concerts have included the London Mozart Players, London Bach Orchestra, CBSO, Royal Philharmonic and the Philharmonia. In 2001, she won the London Leider Prize. In 2009 she was made an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music.

Nicholas Oliver, GRSM, LRAM, PGRNCM

Nicholas Oliver, born in London, studied piano at the Royal Academy of Music and the Royal Northern College of Music. He won the Young Pianist of the Year Award in 1984 and was the second prize winner at the 1991 Dudley International Piano Competition, since when he has been enjoying a successful and varied performing career. Concert appearances include several performances at London's South Bank, the Wigmore Hall and at most of Britain's major concert halls. He has undertaken recital tours in many European countries and also performed in the Americas, Australia, Asia and Africa. He has broadcast frequently on radio and released several recordings. He combines the post of Head of Piano Accompaniment and principal study piano tutor at Chetham's School of Music in Manchester with his performing career and is much in demand as a piano teacher and adjudicator. For over twenty years he has worked in the UK and internationally as an examiner and presenter for ABRSM and is a member of both the examiner Trainer and Professional Review panels. He is a writer of Teaching Notes for piano syllabuses and frequently offers INSET presentations for teachers. He is a founder member of "The Commonwealth Resounds", a charity dedicated to promoting music and musicians from Commonwealth countries and in that capacity has led projects in Africa, Australia, Malta, Sri Lanka and the Caribbean. Nicholas was made an associate of the RAM in 1997 and was elected to the Royal Society of Musicians in 2000.

Kathryn Page, LRAM, ARCM, DipRCM

Kathryn studied at the Royal College of Music and went to Canada on a Menuhin Scholarship. She has given over 20 recitals at the South Bank and Wigmore Hall, both as a soloist and chamber music pianist. She has toured Norway, Italy, Ireland and Australia where she gave seven recitals at the Sydney Festival and broadcast for ABC. At home, she has performed at many of the leading music festivals and has given numerous live broadcasts for BBC Radio 3. TV work has ranged from a live recital from Paris on CNN to the Korean broadcasting network, several performances on Irish TV and a much-treasured Blue Peter badge.

Steven Roberts, MEd, BA(Hons), CertEd, BBCM, CMS

Steven has been a musical adjudicator since 2001; has sat on the Adjudicators' Council and in 2020 was re-elected for his third term of office to the Board of Trustees. He is a busy professional in conducting, teaching and lecturing. He brings with him experience as a manager, knowledge of quality systems, business acumen and many years of leading change. He has successfully combined a career in education with his work as a conductor, musical director and adjudicator working both in this country and in Europe and as far afield as Peru and Bahrain. Steven has conducted numerous concerts throughout this country and Europe with a variety of choirs, ensembles and orchestras, winds bands and brass bands. He studied piano, brass and voice and has worked in a variety of musical settings. He has worked alongside actors and dancers on many projects and is keen to support the work of the Federation to maximise opportunities for performance in all disciplines. He enjoys working with his colleagues on the Board, Council and the wider community of volunteers that keep our Festivals vibrant. Having previously held the post of Director of External Relations at Barnsley College he has excellent communication skills and enjoys collaborative working.
